



Reading Exhibits - Tailoring

If you want students to read a leveled text on the screen, some tailoring prep work is required. This lesson tells how to create those passages so that when a student sits in front of the computer to read, the text will appear on the screen. Tree View: Choose a Topic or Example

This panel provides limited tailoring capability. For full tailoring, use the Master Tailor program.

Fonts... Edit the fonts used to display prompts and data.

Symbols... Edit the symbols used to evaluate an example.

Reading Samples... Edit reading sample texts.

Edit Topic Card... Change the contents of the selected topic card.

Example Templates

- Copy...** Create a new template as a copy of an existing one. (Then edit it as appropriate.)
- Edit...** Change the contents of the selected template. Edit descriptors.
- Delete...** Delete the selected template.

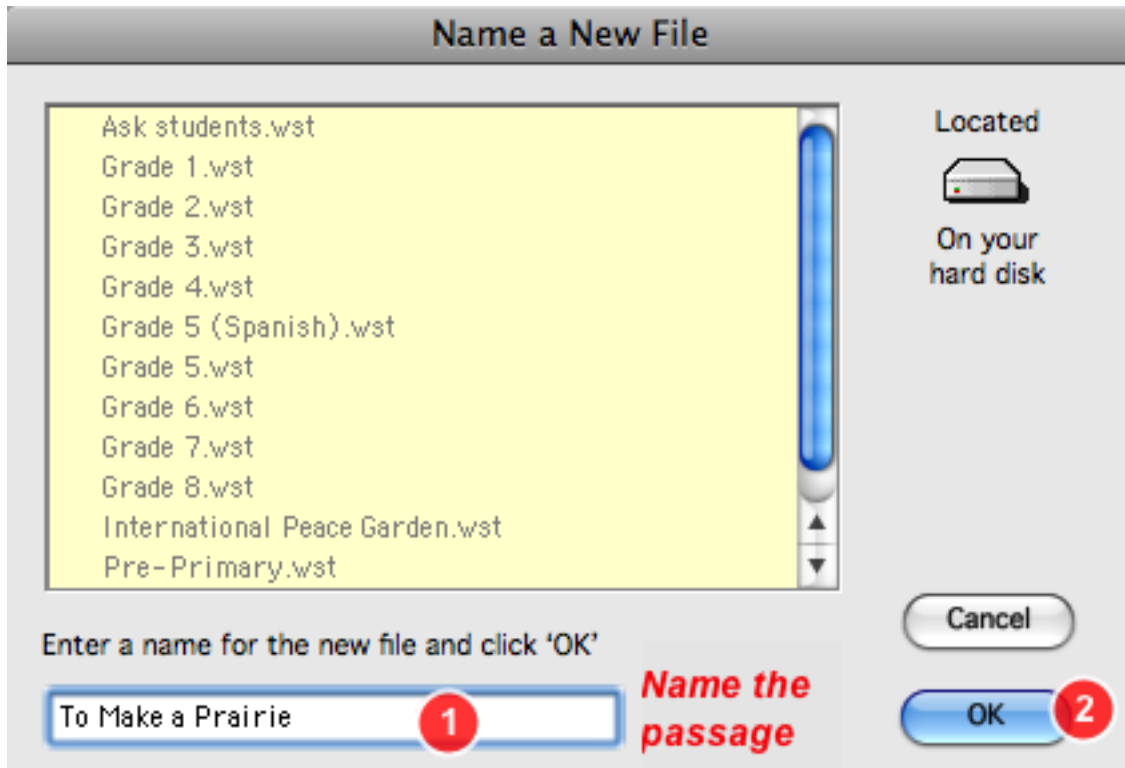

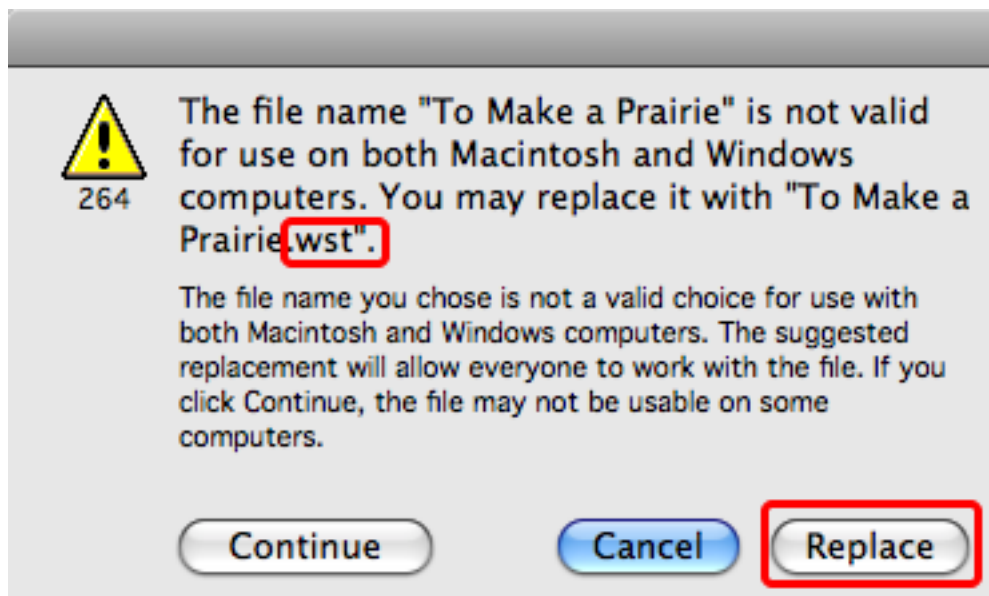


Enter a name for the passage. Click OK.
